Application for Program Year 2022-2023 Deadline to Submit an Application: August 29, 2022

Leadership Wayne is a program of the Wayne County Chamber of Commerce and is designed to interact with a corps of leaders dedicated to the betterment of the community through service. Participation is open to persons who are recognized as emerging leaders, as well as those persons demonstrating leadership potential. The program seeks men and women who have achieved leadership positions within their field and who are likely to be recruited for community service.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

Participants will be chosen by the Selection Committee of Leadership Wayne, and are subject to the approval of the * Team Building * Community Service Board of Regents, a volunteer committee of alumni that administers the program. The committee seeks representation from a cross-section of the community — business, industry, education, government, community-based organizations, ethnic and minority groups.

Basic criteria that must be met by all applicants:

- 1. The candidate must live or work in Wayne County. If employed full-time and the employer is funding the tuition, the candidate must have the endorsement and commitment of his or her employer.
- 2. The candidate must understand and accept the program's expectations regarding attendance, community project and other program guidelines.
- *Community Awareness 3. The candidate must have a sincere commitment to serve the community demonstrated by detailed and specific information provided in this application.

In reviewing applications, the Selection Committee looks for potential participants who demonstrate the following:

- Commitment and motivation to serve the Wayne County area.
- Ability to make the time commitment required by the program.

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ATTENDANCE POLICY: ______ Initial here indicating that you have read and understand the Attendance Policy shown below.

The success of the Leadership Wayne program depends on the full commitment of each participant to attend all program sessions, arrive on time and stay for the entirety of each day. Even though emergencies do arise, full participation is expected for all sessions, project and interim activities. Questions pertaining to the Attendance Policy should be directed to the Class Liaison.

Leadership Wayne begins with a mandatory opening retreat in September and is completed the following May with a 1/2 day retreat. The ending retreat is mandatory, participants are expected to attend, as it brings closure to the year and allows time for classmates to offer feedback on the current year's program and share ideas for next year's program. Beginning in October, the class meets one Thursday a month for 8 months and completes a community project prior to graduation.

All participants are required to attend the Leading Wayne Luncheon held in the fall. All participants must actively participate in the class project and attend each class day.

Class Members will be held accountable for class day attendance, class meeting attendance, posted deadlines regarding the program, and the selection of their mentor using a 2 Strike Policy. Class members will be notified by the Class Liaison after the 1st Strike. It the class member receives a 2nd Strike, the Class Liaison will give them an opportunity to appeal to the Regents. If a class member receives 2 Strikes and an appeal was not given by the Board of Regents they will not be allowed to continue in the program, participate at the graduation, or receive any certificate. (Absences from monthly class days due to military service or Family Medical Leave Act will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the Board of Regents to determine if the absence will be excused.) During 4 class days, the class will participate in LEAD discussions on topics pertaining to leadership. The class will receive source material, if any, relating to the topic of discussion prior to each of these class days.

CLASS PROJECT POLICY: _____ Initial here indicating that you have read and understand the Class Project Policy shown below.

All class members must participate in and complete a class project together for the betterment of Wayne County. Project applications will be received from local charities and other non-profit organizations within the community and will be reviewed by a Selection Committee to ensure each project meets the criteria for the program. Class members will also be given the opportunity to submit a project application to be considered by the Committee. The Selection Committee will then review the projects and the approved projects will be presented to the class. At the Opening Retreat, the class will begin a discussion of the projects submitted and ultimately decide on their class project. Class members will be expected to present a final proposal of their class project to the Regents by the December 7, 2022 Board of Regents meeting. This presentation must also include a plan for how funds will be raised to complete the project. The project itself must be completed by April 28, 2023, with a presentation/dedication ceremony to follow that is to be planned and implemented by the class.

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INTENTIONAL MENTOR PROGRAM

The Intentional Mentor Program component seeks to connect individuals on a one-to-one basis with a mentor of their choosing, from within or beyond their current organization. Under some conditions, one's direct report (boss/manager) may qualify as a mentor, if a mentoring process is not currently required or being engaged in. Mentor cannot be a family member of the class member. The requirements of the mentor/mentee relationship are outlined below. Justification for how the mentor was chosen, as well as what the Leadership Wayne participant hopes to gain, must be submitted through the Intentional Mentoring Program Application to the Board of Regents. Such justification should be emailed to the Class Liaison by the start of the first Leadership Wayne class day, October 20, 2022, and is not to exceed two paragraphs. The Board of Regents will review, then approve or deny mentorships based upon their discretion. Complete details of the program along with the application will be provided to class members during the Opening Retreat.

Care should be given in seeking out a mentoring relationship; thus, the Board of Regents are available to help facilitate connections with leaders and organizations that a Leadership Wayne participant may not yet have a connection with. Remember, the goal of this component is to dive deep into the leadership style, approach, experiences, and understandings of the mentor – not simply to job shadow. Suggested questions for mentees to ask of their mentors will be provided, but conformity to this wordage is not required. Leadership Wayne participants will be given the opportunity to debrief at the closing retreat.

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Because the number of appointments maybe limited, applicants who are not selected are encouraged to reapply. The tuition for the program is \$750 for Chamber members and \$850 for non-members. Tuition will be fully refunded if an applicant is not selected. **Applications submitted** before August 15, 2022 will receive a \$50 early bird discount on the tuition. Because Leadership Wayne is a community program, a Wayne County Chamber of Commerce membership by an applicant's sponsor is given weight in accordance with the stated selection criteria. Leadership Wayne strives to choose a diverse cross section of applicants and does not discriminate based on age, sex, race, handicap, religious affiliation, or sexual orientation.
